which serve at the
center of a community
network. Risks are
identified, mitigated,
and tracked through
coordination across

multiple organizations. Researchers will analyze Pathways Community HUB certification standards and the extent to which they may foster alignment efforts in communities served by HUBs around the four core components of alignment. Additionally, researchers will evaluate the alignment processes in three communities served by care-coordination HUBs. The evaluation seeks to develop insights on the status of alignment in these communities and potential factors influencing alignment.
