PROJECT SUMMARY



This project will conduct a formative evaluation to assess implementation factors that prevent providers from effectively bridging the gap between health care settings and services available in the community. Process adjustments will

be proposed based on the Cross-sector Alignment Theory of Change. A portfolio of demonstration projects implemented in New York City's public hospitals will be used to test whether the Cross-sector Alignment Theory of Change can improve the quality of connections from clinical providers to community-based organizations for provision of community-based services.
