SUMMARY

This study will test the relevance and applicability of the Cross-Sector Alignment Theory of Change within American Indian and Alaska Native nations (tribal nations). The study will engage tribal stakeholders in practice-based research to identify and describe an emerging, complementary

theory of change framework within tribal nations. This study will provide essential evidence to clarify how cross-sector alignment may occur and thrive within a tribal context. Indigenous knowledge systems are grounded in the concept of relationality and interconnectedness, which may benefit the Cross-Sector Alignment Theory of Change by uncovering unique cultural and contextual strategies and perspectives.
